Harriet Bartlett

Harriet was a winner of one of the coveted Danny Awards at Celtic Connections in 2003. Playing Celtic music on piano accordion with lightning fingers and now singing as well she has performed at many festivals, theatres and clubs over the past four years. She recorded her first CD “Eyes Wide Open” in October 2003 Produced by Phil Cunningham and joined by Ed Boyd (Flook) on guitar and Mark Maguire (Deaf Shepherd) on bodhran launched at Celtic Connections in January 2004 and receiving excellent reviews. Harriet has an endearing personality and could charm the birds off the trees. She has been invited to play on stage with Aly Bain and Phil Cunningham on numerous occasions. This will be her first visit to Glenfarg so come along and hear her.

New Celeste

Initially formed in the 1970s combining folk, rock and jazz players from the Glasgow music scene the band toured extensively in Britain and Europe and recorded three albums. The band broke up in 1983 and guitarist Grame Duffin joined Wet!Wet! Wet! drummer Iain Bayne joined Runrig, guitarist Nigel Clark joined Hue and Cry and violinist Rod Dorothy joined Barbara Thompson’s Paraphernalia. A contemporary version of New Celeste was formed in 1990 and this new band line up are Iain Fergus on acoustic guitar and vocals, Steve Reid acoustic guitar, Willie Logan acoustic guitar and Bobby Miller double bass. Blending traditional styles with jazz, rock and world influences
